An Act amending the Virgin Islands Code, title 20, chapter 33, section 334 relating to the placement of registration stickers on licensed vehicles

PROPOSED BY: Senator Justin Harrigan, Sr.

1 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Virgin Islands:*

2 **SECTION 1.** Title 20 Virgin Islands Code, chapter 3, section 334 is amended in the
3 following instances:

4 **(a)** Subsection (a) is amended after the fourth sentence by adding two sentences that
5 read as follows: “Only one registration sticker may be affixed to the windshield or license plate of
6 the licensed vehicle. Expired registration stickers must be removed upon the placement of the new
7 registration sticker on the vehicle.”

8 **(b)** Subsection (i) is added and reads as follows: “(i) It is unlawful to operate a motor
9 vehicle on a public road with an expired registration sticker affixed to a windshield or license plate
10 of a vehicle. Violation of this subsection subjects the registered owner of a vehicle to a fine of
11 \$100.”
