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OFFICE OF VETERANS AFFAIRS'S OVERVIEW

On March 10, 1955, the First Legislature of the Virgin Islands established the Division of Veterans Affairs within the Department of Labor through Bill No. 21, Act No. 8. The Division was later renamed the Office of Veterans Affairs and placed under the Office of the Governor by Act No. 5265, the Government Reorganization and Consolidation Act of 1987, and Executive Order No. 295-1987.

The mission of the Office of Veterans Affairs is to provide information and services related to benefits and entitlements for veterans in the Virgin Islands. This includes data collection on veterans, informing them of available benefits in employment, health, education, homeownership, and burial, and assisting with claims processing. The Office collaborates with the Community-Based Outpatient Clinic for medical care, the local hospital for emergency care and hospitalization, the local and Federal Housing Authorities for housing, and the Department of Human Services for support services to homeless veterans.

The Office advocates for Virgin Islanders who served in the military, ensuring they receive their entitled services and benefits to improve their quality of life.

Exhibit I

FUND FLOW ANALYSIS

The Office's Fiscal Year 2025 Fund Flow Analysis outlines the Office of Veterans Affairs budget across five (5) key components: appropriation, allotment amount, obligations, expenditures, and balance available; and notes that the obligations reflects commitments OVA made through September 30, 2025. This analysis can be viewed as *Exhibit II*.

As of June 24, 2025, the Office of Veterans Affairs reported receiving \$790,754 in allotments, which represents approximately 65.7% of its total FY 2025 appropriation of \$1,204,369. The OVA also reported obligations of \$590,376 for the last quarter of the fiscal year, bringing the total amount obligated for FY 2025 to \$1,219,142. This represents an over-obligation of \$14,773, which is about 1.2% above the total appropriation.

Total expenditures have been stated by the Office as \$628,766, leaving a balance of \$575,603 from the revised FY 2025 appropriation. This balance comprises,

- \$413,615 remaining unallotted, which represents 34.3% of the total appropriation.
- \$161,988 of the allotment received to date has not been spent, representing approximately 20.5% of the allotted funds.

While financial activities reflect strong execution of its planned activities, with obligations and expenditures demonstrating active use of the appropriated funds; the Office has exceeded its original appropriation by a modest amount, indicating effective management of available resources despite an increase in obligations.

However, the remaining unallotted funds (34.3%) and unspent allotment (20.5%) suggest a need for closer monitoring in this quarter as it's the final quarter of FY 2025; to ensure that allocated resources are fully utilized.

Final quarter obligations comprise:

- \$362,948Operating Expenses
- \$227,428 Medical Travel & Burial (Estimated)

Expenditures to date in the amount of \$628,766:

- \$406,194 Operating Expenses
- \$222,572 Medical Travel & Burial
 - o \$59,830 Medical Travel
 - o \$162,742 Death Benefits

The Office of Veterans Affairs also received additional funds of \$225,000 for Medical Travel and Death Benefits. This breaks down as \$112,500 for Medical Travel and \$112,500 for Death Benefits respectively.

FISCAL YEAR 2026 BUDGET SUMMARY

The Governor has recommended a General Fund appropriation of \$1,219,369 for the Office of Veterans Affairs (OVA) for Fiscal Year 2026. A three-year financial summary is provided in **Exhibit III**. Notably, in Fiscal Year 2025, OVA's budget ceiling was **not adjusted** to reflect the removal and transfer of utility costs to the Single Payer Utilities Fund, resulting in no corresponding reduction in the agency's appropriation.

PERSONNEL SERVICES

The Governor's Fiscal Year 2026 General Fund recommendation for Personnel Services is \$340,519, reflecting a decrease of \$451, a 0.13% difference from the Fiscal Year 2025 appropriation of \$340,970.

During Fiscal Year 2023, the 34th Legislature of the Virgin Islands appropriated funds for the construction of a Veterans Multi-purpose Center at Parcel F. Submarine Base, No. 6 Southside Quarter, St. Thomas. Act No. 8560, appropriated \$1,500,000 for the construction of the Clarence Beverhoudt, Sr. Veterans Complex. As of July 31, 2024, \$237,160, was encumbered from the amount to start the design of the project. Of the \$237,160; \$27,493.48 has been paid to NV5, Inc. as of June 24, 2025. see *Exhibit VIII*. The Office is awaiting the extension of the contract for NV5, Inc. from the Department of Public Works and Property and Procurement as it has expired March 24, 2025.
