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## **DEPARTMENT'S OVERVIEW**

On January 12, 1982, Act No. 4666, enacted by the fourteenth Legislature of the Virgin Islands, consolidated the Board of Nurse-Midwives and the Board of Nurse Examiners, to form what is known as the *Virgin Islands Board of Nurse Licensure (VIBNL)*. Additional enabling legislation is provided in Title 3, Chapter 23 § 415 of the Virgin Islands Code (VIC). VIBNL was established to regulate the education, credentialing, and practice of Registered Nurses (RN) and Licensed Practical Nurses (LPN). According to the regulations of the agency Advance Practice Registered Nurses (APRN) are deemed highly qualified and are granted prescriptive authority. Additionally, Certified Nursing Assistants (CNAs) are subject to professional development and disciplinary actions by the Board.

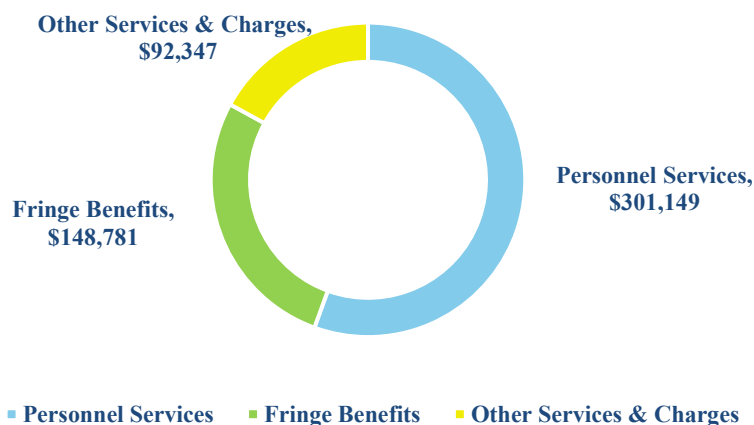
The mission of the Virgin Islands Board of Nurse Licensure is to establish and promote effective policies and standards for nursing education, practice, and professional conduct to ensure public safety.

***Nurse Practice Act (NPA): The 1982 Nurse Practice Act has been updated and forwarded for legislative review.***

## **VIBNL AT A GLANCE**

The Virgin Islands Board of Nurse Licensure received an appropriation of **\$846,078** for FY 2025. As of June 30th, the Virgin Islands Board of Nurse Licensure received **\$705,038** in allotments.

- A total of one thousand eight hundred sixty-nine (1,869) nurses were licensed through the board.
- The National Council State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) awarded financial assistance to digitize and upload all current and available nursing records.

## FUND FLOW ANALYSIS

The Board's Fiscal Year 2025 fund flow analysis outlines the VIBNL's budget across five key components: appropriations, allotted amount, obligations, expenditures and balance available; and notes that the obligations reflect commitments made through June 30, 2025.

The Virgin Islands Board of Nurse Licensure received a General Fund appropriation of **\$846,078** for Fiscal Year 2025. As of June 30, 2025, the VIBNL received **\$705,038** in allotments, representing **83%** of its total appropriation.

Of the allotted amount:

- **\$542,277** (or 77% of the allotted funds and 64% of the total appropriation) has been expended as of June 30, 2025.

**VIBNL currently has an unspent balance of \$303,801, which includes:**

- Unallotted funds: **\$141,040, or 17%** of the total appropriation.

## FISCAL YEAR 2026 BUDGET SUMMARY

The Governor has recommended a lump sum budget of **\$856, 373** for the Virgin Islands Board of Nurse Licensure for FY 2026. Budgeted under the Department of Health, the Governor's recommendation represents an increase of **\$10,295** above FY 2025 appropriation of **\$846,078**. **Exhibit IV** provides a three-year financial summary comparing General Fund recommendations as presented in the FY 2026 Executive Budget.

## NURSE LICENSURE REVOLVING FUND

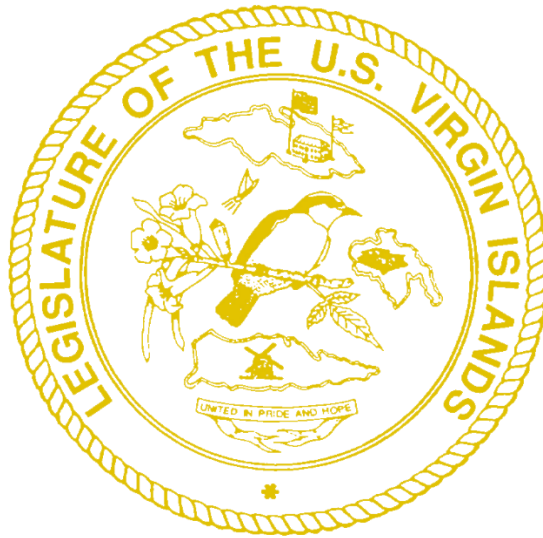
