VIRGIN ISLANDS BOARD OF EDUCATION'S OVERVIEW

The Virgin Islands Board of Education (VIBE or the BOARD) was established as an independent agency of the Government by Act No. 2252 to oversee specific functions in education. These functions include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Oversight of the Territorial Scholarship/Loan Program.
- Oversight of Special Legislative Grants.
- Oversight of federal monies in cooperation with US Department of Education.
- Certification of education professionals.
- Initiation and revision of educational policies.
- Oversight of school plants and facilities.

The Board of Education consists of nine (9) members, four (4) from the St. Thomas/St. John District, four (4) from the St. Croix District, and one (1) member-at-large from the island of St. John. Current Board Members are as follows:

Pursuant to Act No. 5265, the Board holds the express authority to prescribe rules and regulations and to establish the criteria for the certification, selection, and appointment of teachers, supervisors, principals, librarians, and other professional staff within the Department of Education. In addition to its regulatory responsibilities, the Board plays a key role in certifying educational professionals, overseeing the administration of federal education funds, and managing the Territorial Scholarship Program.

The public education system in the U.S. Virgin Islands is administered by the Department of Education and is structured into one State Education Agency (SEA) and two Local Education Agencies (LEAs)—one serving the St. Thomas/St. John District and the other serving the St. Croix District. This governance framework ensures both territorial oversight and district-level management of educational services and resources.

VIRGIN ISLANDS BOARD OF EDUCATION AT A GLANCE

As of July 23rd, Board of Education received \$ 1,989,660 in allotments, representing approximately 83% of its total FY 2025 appropriation. The Department reported obligations totalling \$1,826.897, indicating the early stages of budget execution and the ramp-up of planned activities. A detailed breakdown of these figures is provided in Exhibit I.



As of July 22, 2025, the Board of Education reported the following financial activity based on its FY 2025 General Fund appropriation of \$ 2,387,697:

• **Allotted Funds**: \$ 1,989,660

- Represents 83.3% of the total appropriation

• **Obligations**: \$ 1,826,897

- Represents **76.5%** of the total appropriation

- 91.8% of the allotted funds have been obligated

• **Expenditures**: \$ 1,676,897

- Represents **70.2%** of the total appropriation

-91.8% of obligated funds have been expended

• Remaining Balance from Appropriation: \$ 710,800

- Represents 29.8% of the total appropriation

• Unallotted Funds: \$ 398,037

- Represents 16.7% of the total appropriation

VIBE obligated nearly 92% of its allotted funds for the fiscal year. The remaining \$560,800 comprising both unspent and unallotted funds, provides the Board with strategic flexibility to address emerging priorities or unforeseen needs.

FISCAL YEAR 2026 BUDGET SUMMARY

The Governor has recommended a General Fund Lump Sum appropriation of \$2,137,697 for Fiscal Year 2026. *Exhibit V* provides a three-year financial summary for the Board of Education. In Fiscal Year 2025, the Board's ceiling was not reduced. *Exhibit II* illustrate the actual expenditures reported by the Board of Education for Fiscal Year 2024, expenditures to date for Fiscal Year 2025 and the projected for Fiscal Year 2026, the difference and variance.

PERSONNEL SERVICES

The Governor's Fiscal Year 2026 General Fund recommendation for Personnel Services is \$1,011,103, reflecting a decrease of \$814, difference from the Fiscal Year 2025 appropriation of \$1,011,917. *Exhibit VI* breakdowns this listing by classification.

Personnel data for the **Board of Education** submitted by the **Office of Management and Budget** contain variations but remains consistent with figures published in the **Fiscal Year 2026 Executive Budget**:

- According to the OMB's Fiscal Year 2026 personnel listing, the Office is allocated 18.00 positions funded by the General Fund.
- In contrast, the **Fiscal Year 2026 Executive Budget** reports:
 - o 12.00 filled positions
 - o 6.00 new or vacant positions
- In Fiscal Year 2025, the official personnel listing indicated a total of 18.00 positions.

BANK ACCOUNT

The Board of Education has one bank account held at First Bank with a balance of \$13,722.12 as of June 30, 2025. The Board of Education indicated that this account is primarily for depositing certification of application fees collected prior to the Board's transition to an account managed through the Department of Finance ERP system. A second account is held with Banco Popular with a balance of \$241,774.09 for the Rehenia A. Gabriel Nursing Scholarship. This is a private nursing scholarship at the late Rehenia A. Gabriel request in the amount of \$5,000.00 for six (6) students annually. This account is a bequest and not used for operational expenses.

The Governor has recommended a **Lump Sum** line-item appropriation from the General Fund of \$2,137,697 for Fiscal Year 2026 for the Board of Education. For Fiscal Year 2025, the actual expenses for the Board of Education are \$1,676,897.35 as of July 11, 2025. As of June 30, 2025, the Office of Management and Budget reported that the Board of Education received an allotment of \$1,591,734.40 and has an unallotted amount of \$795,962.60.
