Thirty-Fifth Legislature of the Virgin Islands

An Act amending title 24 Virgin Islands Code, chapter 12 relating to unemployment benefits by: reducing the number of weeks that unemployment benefits can be received; increasing the statute of limitations for the collection of overpayments of unemployment benefits from claimants and for delinquent employer contribution; allowing for the implementation of the payroll variation methodology launch in the calendar year beginning January 2024; implementing a 10-year record retention period for employers; and requiring employers to register with the Virgin Islands State Information Data Exchange System

PROPOSED BY: Senator Novelle E. Francis, Jr., by Request of the Governor

1	WHEREAS, economic insecurity due to unemployment is a threat to the health, morals,
2	and welfare of the people of the Virgin Islands; and
3	WHEREAS, the systematic payment of contributions by employers during periods of
4	employment from which benefits may be paid to workers during periods of unemployment
5	enables the unemployed to meet their essential obligations for a reasonable period until they are
6	able to return to work; and
7	WHEREAS, sixteen weeks is a reasonable period for payment of unemployment benefits
8	that would enable the unemployed to meet their essential obligations; and
9	WHEREAS, the recovery of delinquent contributions from employers is crucial to
10	maintaining the integrity and solvency of the unemployment insurance system; and

WHEREAS, the payroll variation methodology is an equitable way to determine the
 level of contributions that each employer must meet based on their history of consistent
 employment of workers; and

WHEREAS, a continuation of the implementation of the payroll variation methodology
launch to the calendar year beginning January 2024 would allow a launch of the new tax
methodology with online employer access; and

7 WHEREAS, the ability of employers to receive and request information from the
8 Division of Unemployment Insurance electronically and without delay is necessary for the
9 efficiency of the Unemployment Insurance Program; Now, Therefore,

10 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Virgin Islands:

SECTION 1. Title 24 Virgin Islands Code, chapter 12 is amended in the following
instances:

 a claimant's property to assure repayment. The statute of limitations to collect on a lien
 placed on claimant's property is 10 years from the date of the lien."

13	This	bill amends title 24 Virgin Islands Code, chapter 12. Section 303 was amended to	
14	allow for t	he adjustment of the duration of the receipt of unemployment benefits from 26 to 16	
15	weeks. T	nis reduction in weeks will slow benefits and positively impact the unemployment	
16	insurance	trust fund. Section 305 was amended to increase the statute of limitations from two	
17	years to f	we years for the collection of overpayments of unemployment benefits made to	
18	claimants.	Section 305 was also amended to establish a 10-year statue of limitations to collect	
19	on a lien	placed on a claimant's property. Section 308 was amended to allow for the	
20	implement	ation of the payroll variation methodology launch in the calendar year beginning	
21	January 20	24. Section 309 was amended to increase the time period from five years to ten years	
22	for the dis	covery of assets of the delinquent employer which are subject to execution in the	
23	Virgin Isla	nds. Section 312 was amended to provide for a 10-year employer record retention	
24	regulation	. Section 315b was added to require all employers to register with the Virgin Islands
