Claire was there when we opened our first office and interacted with all of themnot just St. Croix, but also St. Thomas, St. John and DC. Her presence ensured harmony and helped to create the open, welcoming, office that we had – one that was reassuring to all who entered, that their issue or concern would be not only heard but addressed to the best of our ability.

At a recent Rotary West event Claire was directing everything - constantly on her feet, when I, younger and who had no previous fracture like she had, could barely walk. We watched her in awe – walking up and down, making sure it all ran smoothly, which, of course it did.

It is often said that if there is a difficult job to be done, give it to a woman, but in the VI, if there is a job that is not only difficult, but complex, and probably has to be done by creating something out of very little or nothing – give it to Claire and you will end up with a masterpiece!!! No one can beat Claire's organizational skills- or her ability to engage people who are already oversubscribed, to help wherever, however or whenever needed. You just can't tell Claire, "No"!

It was only natural that her most impactful service to us in the VI would take the path it did – with its origins being working with her husband in New York where she was immersed in the Black entertainment industry and on moving to St. croix where it started in the complexities of travel: from Pan Am to her own travel agency

Her tenure as director, assistant commissioner and then Commissioner of Tourism saw landmark events such as the unforgettable Folk Life Festival, magically and intimately connecting us in the Virgin Islands to our Senegalese family. But if a famous musical or screen artist was here, you can also bet that Claire's was a hand that made it happen. You know she had that hand in our music festivals.

There are so many things to thank or recognize Clare for, but none is more important that her mentoring of the countess young women who participated in Talented Teen and all the other contests. It was not just that these young women won local, national and international titles. Most significantly and enduringly, it was that they were able to develop their self- esteem, their self-confidence, to hone not only their talents but perfect themselves and it prepared them for life and success in their future endeavors. Many have gone on fulfilling careers, here and elsewhere. That is a remarkable legacy.

As Democratic National Committeewoman, I would be remiss if I did not also recognize and applaud her involvement and leadership in the Democratic Party once serving as St. Croix District Chair, but being the backbone of many a successful campaign, including mine.

In Claire's own words:

My life here at home has afforded me the opportunity to be productive in many areas: Asst. Director of Tourism, Director of Tourism and Asst. Commissioner of Tourism, it has also given me the privilege to be involved with several organizations, such as the Chamber of Commerce, Our Town Frederiksted, Frederiksted Economic Development Association, Women's Coalition, Girl Scouts of America, American Cancer Society (St. Croix Chapter), VIPR Friendship Committee, Virgin Islands Council on the Arts, V.I. Tourism Council, St. Croix Cruzan Christmas Festival Organization, Miss America Outstanding Teen Scholarship Competition and thirty-five (35) years with Hal Jackson's Virgin Islands Talented Teen, a Scholarship Competition and many more community organizations.

In all she freely gave of herself without cost or seeking acclaim or fame!
