- handle psychiatric crises will ensure a more empathetic and
- informed response to individuals experiencing mental health crises.

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- Moreover, including the 9-8-8 telecommunication system
- significantly enhances the accessibility of emergency services for
- 27 individuals in behavioral health crises. The 9-8-8 system streamlines
- the process for individuals to seek help during a mental health
- 29 emergency, providing a dedicated and easily memorable number for
- those in need. This approach aligns with national efforts to
- 31 standardize and improve mental health crisis services access.

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In our line of work at the Virgin Islands Fire and Emergency Medical 33 Services, we often encounter situations where individuals need 34 immediate behavioral health support. The proposed amendments in 35 Bill No. 35-0224 will undoubtedly enhance our ability to respond 36 37

effectively to such incidents, ensuring that those experiencing

mental health crises receive the appropriate care promptly. 38

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Additionally, the legislation demonstrates a proactive approach to 40 addressing the mental health challenges faced by our community, 41 promoting overall public safety and well-being. Investing in 42 behavioral health services and crisis intervention teams contributes 43 to a safer and healthier community for all residents. 44

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In conclusion, we strongly endorse Bill No. 35-0224 and appreciate Senator Diane T. Capehart's commitment to improving behavioral health services in our jurisdiction. The proposed amendments align with our mission to provide the highest standard of emergency medical services to the residents of the Virgin Islands.
