## Virgin Islands Office of Veterans Affairs Legislative Testimony June 22, 2023

Honorable Kenny L. Gittens, - Chairman of the Committee on Homeland Security, Justice, and Public Safety, other Senators of the 35th Legislature of the Virgin Islands of the United States, all that are present, listening via radio, or viewing via the Legislature's LEGIT TV, good morning to you. Today it is my pleasure to provide testimony on **Bill No. 35-0035**, an Act amending title 20 Virgin Islands Code, part II, chapter 39 section 436 (b), expanding the definition of "disabled veteran" for the purposes of eligibility for a handicapped window decal.

In my understanding of the intent of this bill, this bill will clarify the definition of a disabled Veteran in the Virgin Islands. This new and proposed definition is in line with the definition of a disabled Veteran in accordance with the United Department of Veterans. This bill will also allow a path for the proper issuance of disabled window decals and Veteran license plates with a disabled emblem if necessary. For this reason, I am fully in support of this bill.

**Bill No. 35-0035** will enhance the quality of life for a significant portion of Veterans residing within the Virgin Islands. Thank you to the sponsor of this bill for having the foresight and the will to make this a priority on behalf of the Veterans of the Virgin Islands. We thank you.
