Thirty-Sixth Legislature of the Virgin Islands

February 2, 2026

An act honoring and commending Adelbert M. “Bert” Bryan for his outstanding contributions and dedicated service to the Virgin Islands community, particularly on the island of St. Croix, and to ceremoniously name Queen Street in Frederiksted, St. Croix, in his honor as “Adelbert M. “Bert” Bryan Drive”

WHEREAS, Adelbert M. “Bert” Bryan was born on August 21, 1943, in Frederiksted, St. Croix, to Wilmot Bryan and Anesta Samuel Bryan; and was raised on Queen Street in Frederiksted; and

WHEREAS, Bert’s home on Queen Street was the meeting place for boxing, playing steel pan, baseball, marbles and other games; and he and his friends sailed home-made boats in the gutter during heavy rainfall; and

WHEREAS, as the only son among eleven sisters, Bert developed strong values of independence, discipline, and family responsibility that shaped his character and leadership; he learned a sense of community by watching his mother bake bread for the young people; and he learned to sew by watching his mother and sisters, then he used that talent to make shirts for himself and his friends; and

WHEREAS, Bert attended Frederiksted Public Grammar School, Frederiksted Junior High School, and Claude O. Markoe School, graduating in 1961 as a member of that school’s first graduating class; and

1 **WHEREAS**, from an early age, Bert exhibited a deep love for animals – a passion that
2 would continue throughout his life – and acquired skills in the vocational trades of plumbing,
3 carpentry, masonry, and electricity through apprenticeships as a youth; and

4 **WHEREAS**, after graduating high school, Bert was drafted into the United States Army
5 in 1961, where he received a secret clearance after completing advanced training as a
6 communications specialist; and the rest of his military duty was spent in Germany, where he
7 served honorably, participated in boxing and track and field, and was crowned the
8 Welterweight Boxing Champion of the 8th Armored Division in 1963; and

9 **WHEREAS**, upon returning home in 1966, Bert joined the Department of Public Safety,
10 now the Virgin Islands Police Department, rising through the ranks to become Police Captain,
11 while earning an Associate Degree in Police Science from the College of the Virgin Islands in
12 1975, completing advanced training at the Federal Bureau of Investigation Academy in
13 Quantico, Virginia, in 1978, and earning a Bachelor of Arts in Social Sciences in 1988; and

14 **WHEREAS**, Bert successfully challenged institutional injustices during his law
15 enforcement career, including a landmark victory before the Third Circuit Court of Appeals in
16 *Bryan v. Government of the Virgin Islands*, 550 F.2d 890 (3d Cir. 1976), resulting in his
17 reinstatement and promotion within the department; and

18 **WHEREAS**, as Police Captain, Bert ensured the viability and success of the Police
19 Athletic League (PAL) for the youth of St. Croix by providing space, resources, and support,
20 which included removing unnecessary obstacles that blocked the progress of the program,
21 participating in bicycle ride-outs, helping with construction at the camp, organizing community
22 activities, and playing a crucial role in the implementation of the very well-known and widely
23 enjoyed skating on Strand Street events, for which he received numerous commendations and
24 was recently honored by PAL for his steadfast support over the years; and

1 **WHEREAS**, Bert shared his craftsmanship and creativity with the youth of St. Croix,
2 teaching students to build local toys, scooters, and box carts, while emphasizing the importance
3 of self-sufficiency and skill development; and

4 **WHEREAS**, Bert operated “Emancipation Farm” in Estate Lower Love, Frederiksted,
5 where he raised livestock, exotic birds, racehorses, cats, and dogs, and hosted educational field
6 trips for schoolchildren, blending his love for science, agriculture, and education; and

7 **WHEREAS**, beyond law enforcement, Bert dedicated his time and expertise to
8 numerous community organizations, including Little League, Boy Scouts of America, the
9 Juvenile Task Force, and the Virgin Islands Olympic Shooting Team; and

10 **WHEREAS**, in 1982, Bert was elected to the Fifteenth Legislature of the Virgin Islands
11 and subsequently served in the Sixteenth, Nineteenth, Twenty-First, and Twenty-Second
12 Legislatures, where he championed legislation promoting land and home ownership, education,
13 and social justice; and

14 **WHEREAS**, among his notable legislative accomplishments, Bert introduced and
15 secured passage of Act No. 4844, mandating that Virgin Islands and Caribbean History be
16 taught at all grade levels in Virgin Islands schools, an enduring testament to his commitment
17 to cultural preservation and education; and

18 **WHEREAS**, as a legislator and advocate, Bert fearlessly challenged inequities,
19 including a successful lawsuit against the Government and Department of Education in 1984
20 for the extremely poor conditions of the cafeteria, auditorium, and restroom facilities at Arthur
21 A. Richards Junior High School; and

22 **WHEREAS**, he also introduced legislation to protect the rights of workers affected by
23 industrial closures, such as those at the Hess Oil Refinery, demonstrating his enduring
24 advocacy for the working class; and

25 **WHEREAS**, in 1986, Bert ran for Governor of the Virgin Islands with Dr. Gilbert
26 Sprauve of St. John as his running mate, and although not elected, he continued to serve the

1 people as a delegate to the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Constitutional Conventions of the Virgin
2 Islands, and as a member of the Board of Elections, where he promoted electoral fairness,
3 including a successful challenge to the ballot format before the Virgin Islands Supreme Court;
4 and

5 **WHEREAS**, Bert’s influence extended through media and public discourse, as he
6 regularly appeared on radio programs to engage the public, challenge injustice, offer solutions
7 that would take effort and grit, impart knowledge about history and legacy in order to make
8 informed decisions, and encourage civic participation, often concluding with his well-known
9 maxim: “Keep your eyes on the prize, and don’t blink.”; and

10 **WHEREAS**, Bert holds the distinction of being the youngest person in Virgin Islands
11 history to both attain the rank of and retire as a Police Captain (at the ages of 34 and 43
12 respectively), and the first native Virgin Islander to earn a Black Belt in Nisei Goju-Ryu Karate,
13 placing him among a distinguished cadre of martial artists; and

14 **WHEREAS**, Bert has been married to Jerilyn Ovesen Bryan for 58 years whom he met
15 on Queen Street and together they raised 3 children: Lecia, Adelbert, and Nikki; he is also the
16 proud father of Lori, Andrea, Lyrhea, and Mia; he has been blessed with , eleven grandchildren:
17 Jabir, De Andre, Al Andre, Andre, Kemia, Keandra, Earl, Khalid, Afiya, Carina, and Khyra;
18 and he cherishes his great-grandchildren as the youngest generation of his family; and

19 **WHEREAS**, Bert has taught all his children and grandchildren many important values,
20 to include self-awareness, independence, confidence, discipline, leadership, fairness,
21 responsibility, dependability, perseverance, diligence, service to others, and dauntlessness; and
22 he often ends telephone calls with them by saying “Stay Strong”; and

23 **WHEREAS**, Bert Bryan’s legacy of service, courage, and commitment continues to
24 inspire Virgin Islanders of all generations; Now, Therefore,

25 ***Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Virgin Islands:***

SECTION 1. The Legislature of the Virgin Islands, on behalf of the people of the Virgin Islands, honors and commends Adelbert M. “Bert” Bryan for his outstanding and enduring contributions to the people of the Virgin Islands, particularly to the people of St. Croix, in the fields of law enforcement, politics, sports, industrial arts, farming, education, social history, and community service.

SECTION 2. (a) In recognition of his lifelong service and dedication to the people of the Virgin Islands, particularly the island of St. Croix, the Legislature of the Virgin Islands hereby designates Queen Street, located in Frederiksted, St. Croix, to be also known as “Adelbert M. ‘Bert’ Bryan Drive.”. This designation shall be honorary and shall not replace the historic name “Queen Street,” which shall remain the official street name for all legal, postal, mapping, and historic preservation purposes.

(b) The honorary designation authorized by this section shall permit the installation of ceremonial or honorary signage recognizing “Adelbert M. ‘Bert’ Bryan Drive,” provided that such signage is consistent with historic district guidelines and does not conflict with existing street identification or historic preservation requirements.

SECTION 3. The Virgin Islands Department of Public Works shall erect two signs bearing the inscription “**Adelbert M. “Bert” Bryan Drive**”, one at the beginning and one at the end of the roadway.

SECTION 4. (a) The sum of \$10,000 is appropriated from the General Fund of the Treasury of the Government of the Virgin Islands for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2026, to the Virgin Islands Department of Public Works to carry out the provisions of this Act.

(b) The funds appropriated in subsection (a) remain available until expended.

SECTION 5. The President of the Legislature, or the President’s designee, shall present a perma-plaque copy of this Act to Adelbert M. “Bert” Bryan at an appropriate ceremony honoring his service and achievements.

1 This bill honors and commends Adelbert M. “Bert” Bryan for his exemplary service and
2 numerous contributions to the Virgin Islands community, especially the people of St. Croix. It
3 designates Queen Street in Frederiksted, St. Croix as “Adelbert M. (Bert) Bryan Drive,”
4 appropriates funds for the installation of signage, and authorizes a formal presentation
5 ceremony in recognition of his lifetime of public service.
