An Act repealing and reenacting with amendments title 27 Virgin Islands Code, chapter 20, relating to the regulation of the profession of social work and social workers

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Virgin Islands:

- 2 SECTION 1. Title 27 Virgin Islands Code, chapter 20 is repealed and reenacted with
- 3 the following amendments:
- 4 § 531. Definitions
- 5 As used in this chapter:
- 6 (a) "Board" means the Virgin Islands Board of Social Work Licensure.
- theoretical concepts, specific functional skills, and essential social values that are used to effect change in human behavior, emotional responses, and social conditions, and it also entails helping individuals, couples, families, groups, and community organizations enhance or restore their capacities for personal and social functioning while preventing and controlling social problems. Social work practice is the professional application of social work values, principles, ethics, and techniques in the following areas:

1	(1) information, resource identification, referral services, mediation
2	services, advocacy services, and education of individuals, groups, couples, and
3	families;
4	(2) preparation and evaluation of assessments and development and
5	implementation of social work service plans;
6	(3) case management, coordination, casework intervention, and
7	monitoring of social work service plans in the areas of personal, social, or economic
8	resources, conditions, or problems;
9	(4) administration and development of social service programs, policies,
10	community organization, planning, implementation, and involvement in the
11	evaluation of social systems and social policies;
12	(5) social work consultation and resource development;
13	(6) research through the formal design and methodology of data collection
14	and the analysis and evaluation of data, social work programs, social systems, and
15	social policies;
16	(7) psychosocial assessment, diagnostic impressions, treatment of
17	individuals, couples, families, and groups, prevention of psychosocial dysfunction,
18	disability, or impairment, including emotional, mental, and behavioral disorders,
19	and evaluation of practice effectiveness; and
20	(8) clinical diagnosis or psychotherapy, or both, provided by a licensed
21	clinical social worker.
22	§ 532. Practice of social work

1	(a)	Unless otherwise exempted, no person may engage in the practice of social work
2	unless the	person is licensed under this chapter as a social work associate, licensed social
3	worker, lie	censed master's social worker, or licensed clinical social worker.
4	(b)	The scope of the practice of social work is limited as follows:
5		(1) A "social work associate" or "SWA" may perform duties set forth in
6		paragraphs (1) to (3) of section 531(b) as an employee of a governmental agency,
7		a health facility, an educational institution or other entity approved by the Board
8		providing social services under the supervision of an individual who is licensed as
9		a licensed master's social worker or licensed clinical social worker.
0		(2) A "licensed social worker" or "LSW" may perform duties set forth in
1		paragraphs (1) to (4) of section 531(b) as an employee of a governmental agency,
2		a health facility, an institution or other entity approved by the Board providing
3		social services under the supervision of an individual who is licensed as a licensed
4		master's social worker or licensed clinical social worker or, as applicable, a person
5		who retains the license of certified independent social worker in accordance with
6		§ 536(b).
7		(3) A "licensed master's social worker" or "LMSW" may perform duties
8		set forth in paragraphs (1) to (7) of section 531(b). A licensed master's social
9		worker may not engage in clinical social work, except for the purpose of obtaining
0		experience required to be a licensed clinical social worker.
1		(1) A "licensed clinical social worker" or "I CSW" may perform duties set

forth in paragraphs (1) to (8) of section 531(b).

1	(c)	No social work associate may practice except under the supervision of a licensed
2	master's so	ocial worker or licensed clinical social worker or, as applicable, a person who retains
3	the license	of certified independent social worker in accordance with § 536(b).
4	(d)	No person may engage in the independent practice of social work unless licensed
5	under this	chapter as a licensed clinical social worker.
6	(e)	The practice of social work without a license is a misdemeanor punishable by a
7	fine of not	less than \$100 but not more than \$500.
8	§ 533. License by examination	
9	(a)	Every applicant for a license as a social worker shall submit to the Board, in the
10	form presc	cribed by the Board, evidence satisfactory to, and that the applicant is of good moral
11	character a	and meets the education, experience and training requirements.
12	(b)	In addition to the requirements in subsection (a), the Board shall issue a license as
13	a "licensed	d master's social worker" to an applicant who:
14		(1) has a doctorate or master's degree in social work from a college or university
15	appr	oved by the Board; and
16		(2) has passed the examination designated by the Board.
17	(c)	In addition to the requirements in subsection (a), the Board shall issue a license as
18	a "social w	vorker" to an applicant who:
19		(1) has a baccalaureate degree in social work from a college or university
20	appr	oved by the Board or has a baccalaureate degree in a non-social work field or
21	disci	pline, and two years' post-baccalaureate degree experience in a social work capacity;
22	and	
23		(2) has passed the examination designated by the Board.

1	(d)	In addition to the requirements in subsection (a), the Board shall issue a license as
2	a "social work associate" to an applicant who:	
3		(1) has a baccalaureate degree in a non-social work field from a college or
4	univ	ersity approved by the Board; and
5		(2) has passed the examination designated by the Board.
6	(e)	In addition to the requirements in subsection (a), the Board shall issue a license as
7	a "licensed	I clinical social worker" to an applicant who:
8		(1) has a doctorate or master's degree in social work from a college or university
9	approved by the Board; and	
10		(2) has had not less than two years of post-doctorate or post-master's experience
11	in the prac	ctice of social work under the direct clinical supervision of a licensed independent
12	clinical social worker; and	
13		(3) has passed the examination designated by the Board.
14	§534	. License by endorsement
15	(a)	The Board may issue a license without examination to an applicant who has
16	satisfied th	e Board that the applicant has passed an examination and is or has been licensed or
17	registered	under the laws of another state, territory, or political subdivision of the United States,
18	whose sta	ndards, in the opinion of the Board, are the substantially equivalent of the
19	requirements of section 533, and whose license has not been suspended or revoked by the	
20	licensing jurisdiction.	
21	(b)	An applicant for licensure under this section is only eligible for licensure at the
22	equivalent	designation recognized in the jurisdiction in which the applicant for a license by
23	endorseme	ent is currently licensed.
24	§535	5. License requirement

- (a) Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, it is unlawful for a individual to engage, or otherwise attempt to engage, in the practice of social work unless licensed as a social work associate, licensed social worker, licensed master's social worker, or licensed clinical social worker under the applicable provisions of this chapter. No persons licensed under this chapter may engage in the practice of social work beyond the scope of their license.
- (b) No person may purport to be a social worker or qualified to engage in the practice of social work, by using the titles "social worker", "social work associate", "licensed social worker", "licensed master's social worker" or "licensed clinical social worker", or use the letters "SW", "SWA", "BSW", "LSW", "MSW", "LMSW", or "LCSW" or use any or symbols indicating or tending to indicate that the person is a social worker, social work associate, licensed social worker, licensed master's social worker, or licensed clinical social worker, or engage in the practice of social work as defined in this chapter without meeting the applicable requirements and holding a license as set forth in this chapter.
- (c) The Board shall reissue the appropriate redesignated license to a person licensed before the passage of this chapter as a "social worker", "certified social worker" or "certified independent social worker". Notwithstanding the foregoing, a license issued to "social worker", "certified social worker" or "certified independent social worker" continues to be valid for the duration of the license or until the Board issues an appropriate redesignated license. A person licensed by the Board as a "social worker", "certified social worker", or "certified independent social worker" may continue to use the prior designated licensure titles for a period of two years or as otherwise provided by the Board. Except as specifically provided otherwise, licensure titles are redesignated as follows:
 - (1) a "social worker" is redesignated as a "licensed social worker";

- 1 (2) a "certified social worker" is redesignated as a "licensed master's social worker"; and
 - (3) a "certified independent social worker" is redesignated as a "certified clinical social worker".
 - (d) A person who, after a hearing, the Board finds to have unlawfully engaged, or attempted to engage, in the practice of social work, or a person who knowingly assisted a person to unlawfully engage in the practice of social work, is subject to a fine of not less than \$100, but not more than \$1,000 for each offense. Violations of this section are also subject to the penalties outlined in § 532(e).

§ 536. Exemption from requirement

- (a) Licensure under this chapter is not required of:
- (1) a person licensed in the Virgin Islands doing work within the scope of practice or duties of the person's profession and ethics of their respective professions that overlaps with the practice of social work; provided the person does not hold themselves out to the public by title or description of service as being engaged in the practice of social work;
- (2) a student enrolled in an accredited educational institution in a recognized program of study leading toward attainment of a degree in social work; provided, that the student's activities and services are part of a prescribed course of study supervised by the educational institution and the student is identified by an appropriate title such as "social work student", "social work intern", or any other title which clearly indicates the student's training status; or

- 1 a person who is a duly recognized member of the clergy; provided, that the (3) 2 person functions only within the person's capacities as a member of the clergy; and 3 provided further that the person does not purport to be a social worker. 4 Notwithstanding the provision of 535(c)(3), a person licensed under the laws of the 5 Virgin Islands as a certified independent social worker who does not engage in clinical practice 6 shall maintain the license designation of certified independent social worker. 7 A person exempted under this section is not engaged in the unlawful practice of 8 social work. 9 §537. Confidentiality 10 No social work associate, licensed social worker, licensed master's social worker, (a) 11 or licensed clinical social worker shall disclose any information acquired from or provided by 12 a client or from persons consulting with the social worker in a professional capacity except: 13 with the written consent of the person or persons or, in the case of death or (1) 14 disability, with the consent of the person's personal representative, or another person 15 authorized to sue on his behalf; 16 that a licensed social work associate, licensed social worker, licensed 17 master's social worker, or licensed clinical social worker is not required to treat as 18 confidential a communication that reveals the contemplation of a crime or of a harmful 19 act; 20 (3)
 - (3) when the person is a minor under the law of this the Virgin Islands and the information acquired by licensed social work associate, licensed social worker, licensed master's social worker, or licensed clinical social worker indicates that the minor was the victim or subject of a crime, the certified social worker, the social worker, the certified independent social worker, or the social work associate may be required to testify fully

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1	in any examination, trial, or other proceeding in which the commission of a crime is the
2	subject of inquiry;
3	(4) when the person waives the right of confidentiality by bringing charges
4	against the licensed social work associate, licensed social worker, licensed master's
5	social worker, or licensed clinical social worker; or
6	(5) pursuant to the order of a court of competent jurisdiction.
7	(b) A person having access to records or anyone who participates in providing social
8	work services, or who, in providing any human services, is supervised by a social worker, is
9	similarly bound to regard all information and communications as privileged in accordance with
10	this section.
11	(c) Violation of this section is a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not less than
12	\$100.
13	§ 538. Bribery, fraud, misrepresentation and false statements
14	The following are misdemeanors punishable by a fine of not less than \$500, but not more
15	than \$1,000:
16	(1) obtaining or attempting to obtain a license, certificate, or renewal thereof by
17	bribery or fraudulent representation;
18	(2) knowingly making a false statement in connection with or on an application
19	or
20	(3) knowingly making a false statement on a form or in relation to a regulation
21	promulgated by the Board.
22	§539. Grounds for disciplinary proceedings
23	(a) The Board may deny an application or, after a hearing, refuse to renew, suspend
24	revoke, censure, reprimand, restrict, or limit a license issued on proof that the person has

1	engaged in unprofessional conduct within the five years preceding the filing of the complain	
2	or the initiation	of disciplinary action, including:
3	(1)	conviction of a felony;
4	(2)	conviction of a misdemeanor under this chapter;
5	(3)	conviction of fraud or deceit in connection with the practice of social work
6	as defined	in this chapter or in establishing qualifications under this chapter;
7	(4)	aiding or abetting a person not licensed under this chapter who is falsely
8	representin	ng themselves as a social worker licensed under this chapter;
9	(5)	failing to be relicensed and continuing to represent themselves as licensed
10	after the ex	xpiration of their license;
11	(6)	committing an act of gross negligence or condoning the act by an employee
12	or supervis	see in the practice of social work;
13	(7)	addiction to habit-forming drugs, which impairs the ability to perform their
14	work; or	
15	(8)	has knowingly violated a regulations of the Board.
16	(b) In ac	ddition to disciplinary powers provided in subsection (a), the Board may, after
17	a hearing, levy a	nd collect administrative fines for violations of this chapter or a regulations of
18	the Board of not	less than \$100 but not more than \$1,000, for each violation. Each violation of
19	this chapter or a	regulations pertaining to unlawfully engaging in the practice of social work
20	constitutes a mis	demeanor punishable by a fine of not less than \$100, but not more than \$1,000.
21	§540. Dis	ciplinary proceedings
22	(a) The	Board shall conduct all hearings, which must be recorded by stenograph.
23	Board decisions	must be made by majority vote. The Board shall give not less than 20 days
24	advance notice of	of a hearing, which notice must be served personally or by registered mail.

1	(b)	The respondent has the right to:
2		(1) representation, either by counselor otherwise;
3		(2) cross-examination of witnesses;
4		(3) to call witnesses on the respondent's behalf; and
5		(4) to subpoena witnesses and documents.
6	(c)	Judicial review of the refusal to allow an examination, to grant a license, or the
7	review of a	a disciplinary hearing must be in accordance with Virgin Islands statutes regulating
8	judicial rev	view of administrative action.
9	§541	. Renewal of licenses
10	(a)	All licenses are effective when issued by the Board.
11	(b)	A license issued under this chapter is valid for two years from the date of
12	issuance ar	nd expires on the last day of the month of February.
13	(c)	A license may be renewed by the payment of the renewal fee and by the completion
14	and submis	ssion—on a form provided by the Board—of a sworn statement by the applicant tha
15	the license	has been neither revoked nor is currently suspended.
16	(d)	Failure of a licensee to renew the license biennially and before expiration as
17	established	l under subsection (b), deprives the licensee of the right to practice until
18	reinstatem	ent of the license. The license may be reinstated at any time during the first 24

months immediately following the date the license expired by payment of any penalty or

reinstatement fees established by the Board, in addition to the established renewal fee. Failure

of a licensee to be reinstated during the first 24 months immediately following the date the

license expired requires the individual, before resuming practice in the Virgin Islands, to submit

an application on the prescribed form, and to meet all other requirements for licensure. This

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- subsection may not be construed to permit a person to engage in the practice of social work in
 the Virgin Islands without a valid and active license.
 - (e) The Board shall adopt a program of continuing education to ensure that all licensees remain informed of those professional subjects that the Board considers appropriate to the practice of social work. The Board may by regulation describe the methods by which the requirements of the program must be satisfied. The licensee failure to meet the requirements of continuing education results in nonrenewal of a license.
 - (f) A person licensed under this chapter who is not engaged in the practice of social work or who does not live in the Virgin Islands may request, in writing, that the Board place that person's license in inactive status.

11 §542. Fees

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- The Board shall establish and published fees. The Board shall file an annual report of its activities with the Governor of the Virgin Islands and the report must include a statement of all receipts and disbursements.
