FOUNDER/DIRECTOR 2007-2012 BARBERSHOP QUARTET, HARLEM, NEW YORK

“The Barbershop Quartet,” an outreach effort focused on Black men’s health developed by the historic Abyssinian Baptist Church in Harlem. Through a mobile van our services provide education and screening for prostate cancer, colon cancer, diabetes, hypertension, cholesterol, and HIV/AIDS. We aim to reduce the morbidity and mortality from these preventable and curable diseases through early detection and education. Barbershops and beauty parlors are well established in the scientific literature as effective target areas to provide public health education and effect change in screening behaviors. Through our relationships with barbershop and salon owners, who are seen as community leaders, we have been able to have significant turn out for screening events.

In fact, from our outreach programs, over 500 men were successfully screened with 66 abnormal PSAs that led to medical intervention in 32 patients including two diagnosed with prostate cancer, over 250 elevated blood pressures (one patient requiring emergency intervention due to severe chest pain), and approximately 30% of patients with elevated blood glucose and blood lipid profiles each. Of the patients with elevated blood pressure approximately 50% report a family history of hypertension, stroke, heart disease or diabetes. We added HIV rapid testing in the summer of 2008.

PROJECT MANAGER/MEDICAL DIRECTOR 2006-2010 BREAST AND CERVICAL CANCER SCREENING PROGRAM (USVI)

The Breast and Cervical Cancer Screening Program is a CDC funded initiative. As Medical Director, I will be screening patients for breast cancer and providing treatment. As Project Manager, I will work with the government leadership to secure the grant funding and establish the infrastructure of the program for the territory of the United States Virgin Islands. To date I have developed capacity building, performed outreach and education, established community partnerships, negotiated breast imaging service provider contracts and secured additional funding.

The Charlotte Kimelman Cancer Institute is the first regionally based Caribbean comprehensive cancer program centralized in an identifiable, easily accessible facility in which physicians, hospital and supportive care professionals are based.

The Charlotte Kimelman Cancer Institute located at the Roy L. Schneider Regional Medical Center, St. Thomas, USVI, is founded on the principle that patients throughout the Caribbean deserve access to highly supportive, individualized and holistic care. Through its regional alliances throughout the Caribbean, the Cancer Institute emphasizes education, prevention, screening, and early detection, while making available the most advanced treatment and research within a world-class center located close to home.

The organizational structure and governance of the Cancer Institute operate under the direction of dedicated medical and administrative leadership, and the Cancer Institute is financially autonomous as a freestanding entity, while serving as a component of the overall oncology service line. The Cancer Institute’s success is built on innovative partnerships with physicians, other health care professionals and hospitals throughout the

Caribbean and mainland academic medical centers, thus it serves as a regional referral center for advanced cancer research, agents and technologies. The services provided encompass a coordinated continuum of care that is continually evaluated to identify clinical and financial "best practices."
